

Stambaugh Report 1831-Mov

There has been ^{no} settlement made here by any of the N. Y. Tribes claiming under purchase made from the Menominees other than those I have mentioned. About twenty three of the Brothertown tribe arrived here this fall, "1831" and have commenced a settlement at little Kacalain on the river, a distance less than two hundred yards, they could have settled upon land set apart for them by the Treaty made last winter. I advised them to do so on account of their own comfort and safety, and strove to convince them that their "conduct in settling upon land in direct opposition to the provisions of the Treaty, which had already received the sanction of the President and had been laid before the Senate, would be construed as a disregard of the authority of the Gov't and might be prejudicial to their interests. They replied, that they had their "own boundaries" and would settle where they pleased on any land which had been obtained originally from the Menominees, by the N. Y. Tribes and which they afterwards had purchased.

Nov 7, 1885 - In the evening we met on our Temporal and Religious Affairs Concerns - we met once before but we did not come to proceed any business. But now we proceeded to form into a Body Politick - we named our town by the name of Brothertown, in Indian *Eegamquittoowamuck*.
