Peter or -- Peter. I think the writer means Peter Agwrongdougwas or "Good Peter" who was known as a great orator. The letter is signed "I hope you will try to oblige me. Shall feel thankful for it. Very truly yours, Syman C. Draper". There is a PS that makes me think that it might not be "Good Peter" either. It says "P.S. -- Good Peter must not be confused with a very -- Oneida who migrated with his people to Wisconsin rather De-ga-Lou-yo-hu or Peter Somers. They were very different men".
