This being Sunday I thought it
a good time to write you a few lines
I am well and all I have to do is
Eat and Sleep and give Fodder and
plenty of it and a good deal nothing
to bother only the drunken Irish who
are numerous but cannot make any
disturbance in the home

I like it very well so far but have
not drew my clothes yet but think I
will Wednesday and be assigned to
my Co and then I will be a soldier
again

I suppose there was some talk about
 my sudden leave but I intended to
 do this as soon as the trigger claim was
 settled our meals are regular 5.30 we
 get up 6.30 breakfast 12 dinner supper
 5.30 and bed any time after that and be
 quiet at 8. so far I like it and shall try
 and stay the winter but may take a trip
 back there through the holidays but
 Thanksgiving we expect a grand
 dinner Turkey and Cranberries and
 other goodies to numerous to mention
 did Marsh tell you about those
 things and did you get them
 so now I will have to call this off

for this time hoping I may hear
from you when convenient with
all the news I suppose Caly and
her best fellow are still on the war
path and now will close with all
kinds of good wishes to you and
all the rest
