Dear Sir:

The receipt of your favor
of the 10th inst is hereby gladly acknowledged
The enclosed communication from me to the
Stockbridge, Munus & Oneidas at Oneida, Wis.
will give you the situation of the premises. Their
action cannot affect the Brothertons, & yet
their new attorneys claim that some of the Broth-
ertons signed their paper, & they were expecting
others to do so. Therefore it would be well for
all the Indians to join in a general protest.

I heard you a paper for that purpose which
may be signed by any Indian belonging to
any party or tribe. If not done in Council
it may be signed by any one you can get to
sign it & the more the better.

I received last night a Protest of similar
nature from the Stockbridge & Munus, & I refer
one from the Oneidas also. That it was not the
act of the tribe, but of a few persons.

A similar paper from some people will
do good, & if you could have the Brothertons, Stockbridge
Munus & Oneidas all sign under their appropriate names.
As indicated it would be a good thing.
