

1836 - The Govt began building the military road from Ft Howard to Ft Winnetago at Portage. It was not much of a road even for those days and could not be used except in dry weather or after the ground had become frozen.

This was the year that Cutting Marsh, a Pres. Min. built a Mission house at Stockbridge.

1837 - The first crime was committed, John Palmer

1838 - A mail route was established between Green Bay and Portage. They made one trip ^{a week} to Portage and back, and the service was let by contract. Samuel Newland was the first carrier and rec. \$1200 a year.

1839 - By an act of Congress, ^{they were granted} their citizenship and a tract of land 4 miles wide and 8 miles long containing 23040 acres.

1840 This tract of land was survey by S. H. Featherstonhaugh in 1840 and divided into 100 acres lots and each Indian received 6 1/2 acres of land. It had been previously surveyed by Jeremiah Manchester and the township was known as Manchester until 1856.

They also held their first county election in this year. The polls were opened at the home of Elhanah Dick and the Mission house at Stockbridge. John Jenson Sr, Daniel Dick and David Fowler were elected Co. Comm. and all of the remaining offices were filled by Croshetown Indians.

The census taken at this time placed the pop. of Cal Co at 270 of which 250 were Indians.

1840 - The Govt established a post office here and called ~~the~~ it Pequot. Before this the village had been called Deansburgh in honor of Thomas Dean, the Tuckee, who had acted as their Indian agent, lawyer, ^{and} surveyor, and was called by them, their white father. It was he who helped them select their new home in Wisconsin. The post office remained Pequot until 1857 when it was changed to Brothertown. The Govt closed it in 1903 and it seems fitting that the last postmaster should be Edgar M. Dick a grand son of the first settler, W^m Dick.

1842 - It was in this year that Randall Abner, J. C. Hamme, David Wiggins, W^m Fowler and Hephiah Fowler as trustees for the Methodist Episcopal church bought of Thomas Cornmuck a parcel of land for \$35⁰⁰ and there erected the church which is still standing in the village.

1843 - Stephen Houghtaling brought a boat from Buffalo to Green Bay, up the Fox and to Brothertown. The Brothertown Indians overhauled the hull and replaced the woodwork after which it was towed to Taycheedah and the engine overhauled. They named it the Manchester and was considered a very good boat. Speed.

1846 - Rev. Garrett Fowler arrived with a group of Free Will Baptists. He died in 1848.

1848 - The mill was rebuilt and converted into both a saw and grist mill. A boiler and engine was installed, and it was said that at certain

selected as the county seat and the court house
finished so that from this date all county proceedings
were conducted at Chilton, and from this date the
Indians were gradually eliminated from the Co. office
The last to serve was L. P. Fowler as Reg of Deeds and
Orsamus D. Fowler as Co. Treas.

1865 During the Civil War they furnished 70 men
1864 for the Union cause. Some served with the
cav. in Missouri, some with the army of the Potomac
but the most of them were in that famous regt
the 21st which marched with Sherman to the sea

1882 - Rutherford B Hayes authorized. Later Dick Sen. L. S. Fowler
David Fowler, Orion E. Fowler as trustees of the Brothertown
Indians to sell all unallotted tracts of land and
from this date they have gradually sold all of
their land until they only own a few acres and of
the original 300 ^{people} we have only 29 left in the
town of Brothertown today

1917 During the World War they again furnished their
quota. Most of them enlisting in the Rainbow and
Red Arrow Div. and we again ^{find} the old names on
the rosters. such as ~~the~~ Miles, Kinross, Hammer
Fowler, Shelly and Johnson. and if you would
know what ^{my men} kind of soldiers this later generation
made just ask their commanding officers and their
buddies. Thus we leave them and we
hope the next 100 years will deal more kindly
with them ^{than the} last
