but their money is play'd out now so they
cannot get quite so drunk the was between

day^s it made me so disgusted I came

old fools as this is here Jim Kinross can't
hold a candle to some here

Well I got a letter from Jim and they
were all well and at the same place he
was in the printing office but intends to
get away from there soon as he gets his
money and it out on the R.R. I suppose

Marcia's I sent it to her yesterday
