

- 207 Samuel Kirkland was the most successful missionary
- 207 - The seven settlements were at Charleston, Groton, Stonington, Miantic, Farmington, Montauk and Mochegau
- 208 Living example of a Christian community was needed by the Oneidas, Oneida
- 209 - Copied after Connecticut town Govt Brothertown was suggested to them by Beainers settlement of that name, now known as Indian Mills, Pa. Joseph Johnson made it a success
- 210 First gathering held at Mochegau 7/13/1775 circular letter follows Johnson's activities of the church at Kanawaraha Jan 20/1774 to the Oneidas, and adopted by Oneidas
- 233 - Stockbridge's death - Housatonic
- 234 - Stockbridge incorporated 1734, 6th of June
- 235 - 1000 houses built in English fashion
- 242 - 40 lived at Stockbridge in 1780
- 245 - Stockbridge land in town of Vernon and some in Madison Co
- 252 - Monday Nov 7 - Met and organized the town of Brothertown, 1785 Description of the village J. Fowler clergy
- 253 - a land of Plenty
- 288 - an act for the relief of Brothertown 1791 - Govt. 3 Trustees
