Page 707 - David Fowler ordained as schoolmaster in

"a youth of good abilities whose activity
and prudence, by his friends have much
recommended him" which Wheelock
first school at Kanawarohast
David married Hannah Barrett
in July 1766

117 David Fowler traveled 40 miles
for aid to Boston, in ten days
Returned to Montauk to care for his
pupils on Sept 8, 1767. Taught school
at Montauk until 1770

O'conn left for Eng. Dec 23 - 1865 - Ship Boston
arrived Feb 2 - 1866
Presented to Earl of Dartmouth
He was then 43 years old

The first church was erected about
1750 and was 25 ft square. The new
one was built 1859. He could not read
succeeded by John Sebastian and he
by Moses Stanton ordained Mch 17, 1823
who died at Ann Harbor in 1844
Garon Sebastian was the last minister
ordained 1858

197 Jacob Fowler was tutor at Dartmouth
in 1774. Taught the Pequots from 1770-74
for 12 lbs a year

Niantic, Narragansett, Pequot
Mohegan, Montauk, Tuxis

200 - lost heavily in the Indian wars
and Rev.
