July 27 1862
Dear Friend

I Received A
Letter from you yesterday Dated
the 18 that was the first Letter
that I have had since I

But was not going to send
C. Enys more O the letter
found me in good health
Better than it has been I
had something that Ached
like the Oresiples
Oresiples but I that is
Better if I was out here in
the Army all low I don't
know as I should ever
think of writing But I
Seeing the boys writing

it kinder Reminds
me of it I tell you
that there is a great
meny sick in our
Regt and it is hot
As I sat down here
you spoke a bout the
folks had just be-
gun to Harvest or
Rather Hay it the wheat
has been fit to Cut for
over six weeks down
here we have got a
Camp for this Summer
I think say the Run
of things I tell you
this war is Carried on
the chances that a war
ever was was it is
just keep up for
some of the I big
Boys to make a little
money on and when

they get their pocket
full this war will be over
with I wish that I was
out of it they might do
just what they are a
mind to but I suppose
that they will do just
as they are mind to say
How if I was do
it how they might
draft and be bugard
they never would get me
I don't know as this
Rebellion is any near
to an end than it
was a year ago but
they got filed up pretty
well on this Stragel
