It ends "I must close with my compliments and best wishes to the whole family and inquiring friends from your son E. Dick". Written in the corner above the blue stamp in pencil is "Was with Mrs. Boyd's Brother DN Halshead". There is also a pressed stamp in the top left corner of the first page that goes through to the last page (two stamps in the middle of the unfolded paper).
