Dear wife

I sent a dollar in your letter
for ^{low}Fowler and have you give
it to him i want to pay him
as soon as i can for that lay
and i want you to give him
some of that 20 dollars when
you get it if you can spair if
so i want that paid up as soon
as possible, i have wrote it you
brother Elisha Schooner and
have not got ^{an} answer yet
no more at present

This is april fool day friday
evening i wrote this and send
it the 2 of april it is most, 12/6/64

I set down to write a
few lines to you again i have wrote
to you tow letters since i left
home and i have not got a
nser from you yet since i have
been in the camp i cannot tel
the reason you do not write to me
i sopose you have forgot me,
now you have got your dress
from Ball and all the thing
you wanted from fond du lac
too now you have for got me
but never mind i enjoy my
self hear every day since i left
home i have been looking for a
letter this week from you and
Elizabeth too tel Elizabeth Jamson
if she dont write to me i will
not write too her again never

again i write this to you to tell
you my mind if i am a
solder i have felt well if i do
not live on but bread and coffee
half of the time now i hope i
shall not have to write another
letter like this again to you my
Sattificate as not come yet this
company is a going to masson if
our papers dont come by wensday
that is the 6th of april and kick
up the divel with the big bug
havent you got your five dollar
from the state yet it out to
be hear in brothertown by this
time i have send the paper so
you can get it by the first of
april 1864 that what the
captain told me and all the
men in the company. J. 35 Reg
that all the wife of his men

shall have there five dollar a
month this will be the last
letter that i shal write to you
till i get one from you and
you can tell Elizabeth Jamson
too that i shall not write to
her if i dont get a letter
from her protty soon this is
the first day i have dril
this week because it is very
muddy and we have had
a good deal of rain too so i
have eat and sleep and drink
coffee and bread some times
a lites rice and suger i waia
when i first enlisted 145 and
i wayed 156 pound the first
of april 1864 i hope my girls
is well and all inquirers
friend tell abby to write
to me when she can
