

Kirk, Sr., President, and the Board of Directors of the National American Indian Court Judges Association welcome all participants of this national training session for Indian Court Judges. This will be an intensive 3 days for all of us, but when the problems are extensive, the work must be intensive.

Justice and Judicial enforcement on American Indian Reservations is a special problem demanding special knowledge. The unique problems which it poses — the fabric of tribal law, culture and tradition often at odds with the jurisprudence of the Federal Government and the States, the absence of comprehensive crime prevention programs, an overburdened judiciary, and areas of undefined jurisdiction and court practices, to mention some — require solutions that are fully in touch with the Indian heritage and present Indian aspirations. Obviously, the simple application of non-Indian remedies to Indian needs would be wholly ineffective. In the realm of Law the Indian problem must be considered as "a case apart."
