Gouldsboro March 28th 60

Esteemed Brother,

I am gratified
beyond measure of this privilege of
addressing a few lines to you. in
to you of a Co. of Lieut. which I recd.
the 26th. And you may let it what
perused with gratification.

It found me well, ragged &
dirty as any dog. but you cant
expect any thing else of this Army.
being 44 days on the march, through
Swamps & over Rivers, but we got
out to communication once more,
and every thing is lovely when the
Goose hangs high. I had bulley
health all through. I was detailed as
Forager, that is from every Co. we was
mounted most of the time. I had a
number of different horses. (You'd
ought to see some of the horses we

Captured. I tell You they was gay
and I may know I'd look out for
a fine steed. I had one Cream Horse
that could get up and dust.

Well we've got a nice camp ground, and the
Gen ~~of~~ Opinion that we'll rest here a while
& recruit up. The Boys are well. Waffle
sets here writing on the same desk, with me. ~~Leah~~
Leah is harty, as one could wish.

He holds his own first rate, but Snodock
has been under the weather for some time,
although he keeps long with us all
the while. I think after he get rested
he'll be all wright. Henry Reed is
tough & rugged. JW Wing is well, and
the same old siffener. Thurston Scott &
John Harner was sent back to Beaufort
sick, haven't heard from them since.
Billy Welch was left Sick at Savannah
Gen. Leaden was captured at Eagle Mills.
Mr. C. I seen Dennis (Yesterday)
he is well. Gays Health has been

poor for a while back. Leish
and Gule is well. Well we had some
hard times & good times to on this
March. We found an abundance of
Supplies through the County. Such as
Meal, Flower, Pork, Beef, Poultry of all
kind, Honey Molasses, till You could not
rest, no forager lived well. We would be head
of the main Column, or on the flank. We occasionally
would find some Sausage & little Butters.
I made good many Johnny Cakes & Biscuits
in this march. We only allowed 10 days
rations in the 44 days, and the County
furnished the rest, so You may know
we traveled pretty rich country. We
had plenty to eat all through. Old
Shermons army cut a big Swath through
S. C. they jest more then distroyed
things. I wish I had time to give you an
account of our marches, and things that
occured, we had good deal of Skirmishing to
do, but no hard fighting till the 21st and
22nd.
