The first Doctor was Lorenzo Dick, a good Indian Doctor

Post mortem Thomas Commuck  
Granted citizenship by Congress in 1839

But the school was founded by Brown in 1836 but the  
first election was held Jan 6, 1840 at Elkbranch  
Dicks house. The county officers held the offices in their  
own homes until 1857

It was first surveyed by Jeremiah Manchester and in  
1840 by G. W. Feathermough

First settlers, Wm Dick Jun, Elk Dick, Dave Johnson Isaac Scipio  
Randall Abner, Thomas Commuck

1832 - Daniel Dick - Thomas Dick and Nathan Paul were  
killed 3 years from murder

The first road ran along the shore of the lake from High Cliff to  
Scowbough in honor of Thomas Dean, Indian Agent

School House stood on the north east corner at Friends  
Building stood in the center of road  
Phebe Fowler house stood midway of old road and  
military road

In 1882 Pres Rufusfort & Hayes empowered Lator Dick  
Lucius Spenius Fowler, David Fowler, Owin G. Fowler as trustees  
to sell all un allotted land and place the proceeds in trust for  
said Indians.

A mail service was in establishing the 1st of July 1858  
to Fort Wm. Bag & a distance of 115. A round trip was  
made once a week and first mail carrier was Samuel  
Newland. He received \$1200 a year a parcel of land

In 1842 Thomas Commuck sold to Remond Abner  
John C. Hammer, David Higgins, William Fowler and  
Nehemiah Fowler as trustees of the first Methodist  
Episcopal Soc for 35

The last known minutes of a meeting held by  
the congregation of the Baptist was held at the  
house of Wm. Dick on the 13 day of Feb 1852

1842 - Brown Co school fund 1000 for D is 2102

1852 - One cherry coffin and lead board - 5800

1852 - D & elected Treas of Cal Co

1848 - W N Dick " of Cal Co - school tax for 4 to 1101

1853 - John C Hammer Sheriff

1858 - D & Fowler commissioned a major in the 29 Regt of  
Militia by Gov. Randall

1855 - a horse of oxen was worth \$140

1847 - W. H. Dick county Treas

1851 - L. O. Fowler Reg of Cal Co, Commuck f of Peace

1851 - Lewis Fowler Reg of Deeds

1852 - Woody Mann County Judge

Thomas Dean was a Quaker, was schoolmaster and became agent of the Superintendents, Sen, Sawyer and white father, he and Randal Abner journeyed to Washington to open the way for their pilot His

70 served in the Civil War

In 1832 - The President, 4 weeks from Buffalo to Green Bay and did not arrive here until Aug six men were drowned in one party in 1836  
250 in 1843

1842. Stephen Houghtaling brought the Manchester to Green Bay from Buffalo. It was brought to Brothertown in 1843 and the wood work was repaired and replaced by the Brothertowns. The power was furnished by a worn out Locomotive, This was overhauled at Faycheedah. It was very slow and on one occasion it took 11 days to tow a raft of logs from Oct. to Ft. S. L.

1836 - Military road cut through, under charge of  
38' Regt Gen. George Mercer Brooks from Ft. H. to Ft. W.  
could only be used in dry weather

1842 - Father Jesse Hall had, a Methodist circuit rider conducted services at Brothertown

1835-1836 - Mills were built by Moody Man, Ft. Lowell 41.42

1837 - The first murder and trial

1836 - The first white man settled here, Newfall

1840 - First Co Election was held at the home of Elk. Dick and the Mission house in Stock, at which time

John Johnson, Daniel Dick and David Fowler were elected Co, Comm and David Johnson, D D Fowler, Simon Hunt and John Johnson Jr were chosen to fill remaining offices Roadviewers. Divided in two school and road Dis.

1836 - Alb. S. Ellis was a member of first house rep in 1836
