The writing goes straight across pages 2 and 3 rather than sticking to one page at a time, so the entire back side of the unfolded paper is used as a single page. The writer talks about drills and hanging not being a bad sentence for the "Assassinators". He ends by telling the receiver of father's (Abreham) movement from Washington to Springfield, when and where he travels in between.
