## **Rural Delivery Extensions** To Begin April 1st

On April 1, 1938 several extensions of the rural route will be made to give delivery service to the residences of a considerable number of patrons.

The extensions will be over the following streets:

1. Cañon Drive, one half mile west from El Toyonal to Twin Springs Trail.

2. La Noria Drive, from its eastern to its western junction with Camino Sobrante, thence northwest on Camino Sobrante to La Espiral.

3. La Campaña, two-tenths miles north to the junction of La Punta.

4. La Espiral, north and east from the junction with La Campaña to Las Vegas, making a complete loop on Las Vegas, thence westerly on lower La Espiral to Las Aromas. (Omitting present travel on La Vuelta.)

5. Las Aromas, easterly to Las Cascadas thence southwest on Las Cascadas to Camino

6. Acalanes Road, south from Tunnel Road a distance of seven-tenths miles.

Boxes may be moved after the mail delivery on March 31, and relocated on the right hand side of the road in the direction of travel of the carrier. They must be set so the base of the box is three feet, 10 inches above the ground level. The box should be set off the road but the approach to it must be kept gravelled so that it is accessible by auto at all times. Your name and house number should be painted on the box. This should be on the same side of the box as the Flag, so it may be seen as the carrier approaches.

## Orinda Park, Inc. News

The Orinda Recreation Center, so long a dream of our community, opens this month according to the announcement made by A. W. Elkinton, Chairman of the Pool Committee on the West side. Orinda Park, Incorporated is authorized to conduct a swimming pool and recreation center for the benefit of the people of Orinda. It is further authorized to sell memberships for the financing of the project. Memberships are now being sold and entitle the holder to free use of the park and pool. Membership privileges include the family, permanent household, and unmarried children of the membership holder. A fee of 25c is attached to each guest card, bearing the date, the name of the guest and the name of sponsor. These cards will be collected at the gate of the park and will be filed for future reference. Mr. Elkinton pointed out that memberships in the Park are limited and that they will be available

## President's Annual Report

Article VII, Section 5(a) of the "By-Laws of our Orinda Improvement Association" reads: "The President shall make a written report at the Annual Meeting in March, filing a type-written copy with the Secretary."

In submitting this, my annual report, I cannot help but give the utmost praise to the officers, committee men and women and to the entire membership of our association. Our officers and committee men and women have cheerfully and willingly given their time without remuneration, to accomplish their assigned tasks and our members have always given us a good attendance at our meetings, during fair or rainy weather, and have always been willing to lend assistance, both voluntarily and when called upon.

It is with pride that I report that for nine consecutive meetings all officers have attended each meeting with only one exception, and in that case the officer's report was prepared and submitted, even though he was away on business at the time. This, in itself, is quite a record.

The progress of our Association has been told you at length each month through articles appearing in our paper the ORINDA NEWS, so I will only briefly review it.

Through the splendid efforts of our Membership committee, headed by George Pitt and consisting of Kenneth Allen, Les Dana, A. M. Sands and Harry R. Oakley, our membership up to February 4th, 1938, totaled 207 members, an increase of approximately 150 members. The greater and more unified our membership, the greater our accomplishments can

Our Reception committee has also played an important part in our welfare. Mr. Harry Oakley, assisted by Mrs. Anna Elkinton and Mrs. E. I. de Laveaga have always had the auditorium ready for our meetings, have welcomed and introduced new members and guests, instilling in our membership a warm and friendly attitude.

Many of you attended the enjoyable association parties given by Joe Varni, chairman of our Entertainment committee. His co-workers on this committee include David Jones, Marguerita Keesling, Reuben Chase, Mrs. Harry

Oakley, Sidney Rosenthal, Mrs. George Harrison and many others who have given cheerful assistance. The increase in the funds of our association from \$18.37 on hand June 1, 1937 to \$318.95 on hand February 4, 1938 is due to the fine cooperative work of this committee.

I know that the residents and property owners of this community have been given more information than ever before, through the publication of our ORINDA NEWS, and I believe, also, that publicity through other channels has given this community greater and more favorable recognition than it ever had before. Harrison Ketcham, chairman and his wife Gladys Ketcham, Maurine Donaldson, Dick Cross, J. J. McMillan and Mrs. George Pitt have certainly done a wonderful job. The publishing of our ORINDA NEWS has aided in our increased membership and larger treasury, created a friendlier feeling within our community and has helped all of our committees in their efforts.

It was reported that in one month the bus travel from Orinda to San Francisco on busses operated by the Sacramento Northern Railway, increased 100%. This was due entirely to the determined efforts of our Transportation committee, consisting of Mr. Owen S. Dibbern, chairman, Reuben Chase, A. L. Scott, Jr., C. B. Chantler and H. S. Holt. Letters sent to our membership relative to the transportation question and bus schedules, distributed throughout Orinda, without cost to our association, speak for the efforts of this committee.

The sanitary problems of our community have been ably handled by Ray Dennis, chairman of our Health and Public Welfare committee. Those serving with him on this committee are: Virginia Scott, Stanley Smith, Mrs. R. M. Cross, August Manasse, H. P. Atkinson. This committee has reported to our association, after exhaustive study, that a sewer system in our community is out of the question for some time to come, but that a temporary State inspection system is now in effect, and that the question of a county wide building and inspection ordinance which this committee and at the suggestion of this committee, our entire association has endorsed, is being followed up diligently. Through cooperation with the Health department of Contra Costa county, this committee abated or removed several unhealthy conditions in our community.

Camino Sobrante from San Pablo Highway

Camino Sobrante from San Pablo Highway to the junction of Miner Road is now a part of the County road system. Our Road committee composed of Robert V. Miller, chairman, Dick de Laveaga, W. P. Stephenson and Jim Brockhurst, aided in this accomplishment. This committee has worked for the completion of the Wildcat Creek road, from San Pablo Highway to Tilden Park Golf Course, has studied the question of Road Districts for our community, has had "School Go Slow" signs painted on our highway in front of the school, and is now working on the maintenance of Orinda Highway lights and Cross Road lighting.

I am sure the entire membership appreciates and enjoys the songs that our Music committee, headed by Mrs. Beatrice Cleborne, has rendered for us on many occasions both at our meetings and at entertainments.

When the owners of the Park and Pool on Orinda west side made it possible for the community to do away with a public pool and park, the committee of which A. W. Elkinton is chairman, with Joe Varni, Mrs. Bert Dawson, Earl Norton, Mrs. George Hickok, Mrs. H. W. Harrold, H. L. Gilkey, Dr. Jack Cathcart, Mrs. Wilhelmine Loughrey and A. S. Guerard lost no time in organizing a community recreation center for our own people. Orinda Park, Inc. is incorporated under the laws of the State of California, and by April 1st, of this year, will be operating for our benefit. We all know what an asset that will be.

The addition of the property known as Moraga Estates to the Orinda Fire District was ably handled by Herbert Hauser, chairman of the committee, South of the Tunnel Road, of which Dr. Cary and F. T. Wood are members. This move enabled those building in Moraga Estates to obtain a lower insurance rate and

gave the entire fire district greater assessed valuation.

Mr. John Zuur, chairman of our Clean-Up committee, did a good job in cleaning up our townsite. The County supplied a truck and driver without charge and some of the Boy Scouts and a few citizens helped Mr. Zuur. It is hoped that this work can be extended to cover more territory in the future, and that more scouts and citizens will offer to help.

more scouts and citizens will offer to help.

One hundred and fifty shade trees have been planted along San Pablo Highway; thanks to the efforts of Martyn F. Warner, chairman of this committee assisted by Mrs. E. L. Mathy and Mr. Alex B. Hayward and, of course, all those who generously donated trees for this project.

Mr. Ralph Sisson took care of his "Incorporation of our association assignment" to the entire satisfaction of our members.

Our two other sectional committees, the East Side of Orinda, consisting of G. B. Schuyler, chairman, H. B. Symes, Chester N. Williams, R. L. Palmer, Frank Kales, Ross Mack, Helen P. Stephenson, Mrs. E. L. Mathy, H. A. Haworth; and the North West of Orinda committee, comprising Sydney K. Rosenthal, chairman, H. L. Mortimer, Mrs. J. J. Smeltz, and F. J. Allen have been given no assignments, so there is nothing to report. Other community benefits accomplished through co-operating with other organizations are, a resident deputy sheriff, better and more public utilities, better fire protection, improved elementary school facilities and aid to boy scout troop.

For the members of the association, and personally, I desire to thank most gratefully the officers, committees and members of this association for their splendid work during the past nine months. Their efforts have greatly benefited us all.

Before closing my report, I would like to make the following recommendations for your consideration and endorsement:

1. The appointment of a Tax committee, to study all tax levying bodies before budgets are prepared each year, in order that our members and residents can see our complete yearly tax picture in advance.

I believe, through such a committee, that our tax rate stands a better chance of being stabilized. For instance, if this committee knows that our County or High School taxes are going to be increased in any one year, it might be that some of our other tax levying bodies, such as the fire district, the school districts or the water district could decrease for the same year. If all our tax levying bodies became over-ambitious in the same year, our taxes could increase materially.

2. A card index of our membership, showing name, address, occupation, telephone number, hobbies, preference in sports and other data that would be beneficial in the appointment of committees.

3. The adoption of a yearly clean-up week.
4. The adoption of a fiesta week, such as California Poppy Week at Orinda.

5. The creation of a special committee to raise funds for our pro-rata of our Boy Scout

6. And last but not least, a continuance of the splendid work toward solving the many important problems and making the needed improvements in our community, namely: better school facilities, both high and elementary; proper Cross-Road lighting; better and wider roads; sanitation; beautification; community playgrounds; our own Town Hall, suitable for a meeting place for our association, for dances, theatrical programs, and the like, together with better fire protection; lower insurance rates; added transportation and continued publicity.


