Hi Karen,

I hope this e-mail finds you well - and I've never meant that more than I do now!

That definitely looks like the north elevation of No. 25 meeting Street and what appears to be the eastern chimney. The property received a Carolopolis Award in 1996 for its full restoration, which included exterior stucco, shutter and window repair. They took off ALL the stucco on all the elevations (the team found that 80% of the stucco was failing) repointed the weak areas and repainted the facade. Do you think these could be 1990s photos?!
