

24 Montagu Street
Bruckner-Cobia House
Constructed 1802-06

This small two-and-a-half story single house was built by merchant Daniel Bruckner. It has a single tier piazza on three sides, now partly enclosed.

25 Montagu Street
John Robinson Jr. House
Constructed c. 1848

This three-and-a-half story brick house was constructed soon after 1847 by John Robinson, a factor in the firm of Robinson & Caldwell, and a son of John Robinson who built the group of Regency houses at Judith and Elizabeth streets, including the Aiken-Rhett House, c. 1820.

27 Montagu Street
Constructed c. 1846

This house was built for Mrs. D.T. Heriot, daughter of Dr. Thomas Eveleigh (who built 23 Montagu for another daughter). The two-and-a-half story brick dwelling remained in the Heriot family until 1885.

28 Montagu Street
Hannah Groning House

Constructed c. 1809; restored 2007—08
This two-story frame dwelling with a pedimented facade was probably built for Hannah Groning, wife of merchant John Groning. She retained it until 1833. The house was remodeled by subsequent owners, but retains most of its Adamesque details.

In 2005, Historic Charleston Foundation purchased this house through its Revolving Fund, which had been divided into several apartments. Shortly thereafter HCF sold it to a preservation-minded purchaser who meticulously restored the house, returned it to single family use and also donated interior easements.

29 Montagu Street
Etsel Adams House

Constructed c. 1850; rehabilitated 1975
Merchant Etsel L. Adams built this house after acquiring the site in 1849 and sold it in 1853. The

three-story brick structure on a high basement has a mid-19th century town house plan.


30, 32 & 34 Montagu Street
Christopher White and Tobias-Lopez Tenements

Constructed 1854

Attributed to Edward C. Jones, architect

The three Italianate houses, one detached and two sharing a common wall, were built in 1854 and apparently were planned as part of a larger group extending west to Smith Street. Their design is attributed (without documentation) to architect Edward C. Jones. 30 Montagu was built by Dr Christopher G. White, the double residence by T. Jefferson Tobias and John H. Lopez.

39 Montagu Street
Harriet R. Simons House

Constructed c. 1881

This two-and-a-half story frame dwelling was built by Harriet R. Simons.

40 Montagu Street
Bernard Wohlers House

Constructed 1891-94; restored and rehabilitated 1963

This rambling two-and-a-half story frame Victorian structure was built by Bernard Wohlers, a grocery firm manager. It combines Eastlake, Queen Anne and Shingle styles of architecture into what the Victorians called the "American" style.

42 Montagu Street
Edward L. Trenholm House

Constructed c. 1850

This two-story stuccoed brick house was formerly a carriage house for 93 Rutledge Ave., built by Edward Leonard Trenholm, merchant and shipper.

44 Montagu Street
John Harleston Read House

Constructed c. 1847; restored 1946

This two-and-a-half story brick villa was built by John Harleston Read, grandson of Col. John Harleston, whose family developed the suburb of Harleston. This site passed from John Harleston
