I've attached the file contents for both 11 Church Street and 13 Church Street. A previous researcher brought to my attention her confusion between the info in both files, indicating that some of the attributions may be incorrect. As I recall (and I had added a note to the file about her concern) her confusion had to do with the association of Thomas Ball with both addresses. So that's why I'm sending the info from both files in case some of the info in the 11 Church file actually pertains to 13 Church, and *vice versa*. If I had time, I'd research this myself but since you're already "on it," maybe you'll be able to determine whether or not the information needs to be corrected or re-filed.
