House History

A younger Charleston building, the pavilioned one-story cinderblock structure at 79 Alexander Street was constructed in 1951-52 on the site of a much earlier structure. The now single family residence features a three bay street façade and a hipped roof with center pediment added in the 1990s. Renovated in the Georgian Revival style, acanthus leaves flank the ends of the pediment and a dentiled door surround with pilasters surrounded the entry below.

Maps of the area indicate that a two-story wooden structure was constructed on this lot after 1872 and by 1902, a carriage repair shop occupied the property. Although no buildings survived on this lot by 1941, a brick foundation remains along the perimeter of the property.

Constructed by the Junior League of Charleston, the current building originally housed the Charleston Speech and Hearing Clinic. Following its use as a clinic, the building was purchased by the Southeastern Film and School Supplies Company. Converting the building into a warehouse, the company gutted the interior and removed all windows. Other than minor updates to the plumbing and mechanical systems, the building experienced little renovation until it was purchased by its current owner in 1984.

The present owner performed an extensive exterior and interior renovation of the structure in a Georgian Revival style. Exterior changes included the construction of a new hipped roof over the existing flat roof, the addition of a central pediment, and the installation new windows. The interior was majorly altered as it was converted to a single-family residence.

The Living Room

Much of the interior woodwork recalls a Georgian design in the style of the English architect William Kent. These details include pediments over the doorways, shell niche bookcases, wainscoting, pilasters, and columns.
