An article from the News and Courier of 19 July 1948 states that at the time the house was three apartmentsl. The same article says the house may date to as far as tack as 1739. Yet this was refuted in a letter to the editor from Samuel Gaillard Stoney a few days later. Mr. Stoney begin by saying how glad he is the author added another 100 years to the age of the house. He states that evidence seems to indicate construction of around 1819. The house was notable for it's solid construction and it's long line of prominent owners. These included John Splott Cribbs, Williams by Thomas Fleming, Dr. Tucker Hoars, Peter Bonnethau, John Flotard, Elias Pohl, William Gilliland, James Shingler, George Walton Williams, Frances Pelzer. It is listed as notable in This is Charleston.

The house was three stories on a raised basement, of frame construction, with a flat roof, encircled by a parapet. The piazza appears to have extended on three sides of the house. On-the above the door piazza entrance to the door was a segmental arch. All sills and timbrels in the house were hand pegged and the siding was nailed with square nails. The hallways had mahagany rails and the lower rooms had hand carved chim ney pieces and heart of pine floors. Some rooms had cypress wood work.
