The newspaper article from 1958 clearly shows the Meeting Street building that would have had the cupola on the roof. It is completely gutted and collapsed on itself.

On December 16<sup>th</sup>, 1952 Southern Railway made notification that it would clear two blocks of their right-of-way (Columbus Street to Woolfe Street) This was to include the building formerly used to repair steam boilers for locomotives and forge shop with two large trip hammers. This is the building you see being torn down in your photo. It faced Spring Street. Demolition started in January of 1953.

The water tank had already been razed on December 10<sup>th</sup> of that year.

The roundhouse had already been razed almost 6 years previous on February 25<sup>th</sup>, 1947
