5. Description of physical appearance:

#34 Hasell Street is a two and one-half story masonry Charleston single house on a raised basement with a narrow rear wing. The parapeted gable end faces the street, and there is a two-tier piazza with Tuscan columns and turned balustrades along the principal west elevation. There are two brick interior chimneys at the east side, and two gabled dormers at the west side. The roofs at the main structure, piazza, and dormers are clad in standing-seam metal, which also sheathes the flat parapet above the piazza. The south façade has dogtooth cornices, a simple belt course, jack arches above the window openings, and sidelights at the single upper level window. At the west elevation, the exterior brick is stuccoed. The principal entry has a transom and sidelights in a plain surround, and retains a four-paneled door.

The rear wing forms a hyphen connecting the two-story brick kitchen house to the main building. The piazza originally wrapped around the house to the hyphen. The rear bay of the piazza was enclosed at both levels after 1955. There has been a series of small additions to the rear of the house and the kitchen house, which was enlarged and configured as a n apartment by a previous owner. A one-story wing with a hipped roof was added to the rear of the piazza enclosure. A projecting entry wing with double door was added at the ground floor of the kitchen house, where the primary kitchen is now located.

The interior of 34 Hasell Street retains its historic plan intact, and much of the historic fabric. Simple openings were made when the first floor rear wings were added. These accommodate modern bathrooms, while the kitchen is in the historic kitchen house. Heart pine flooring, window and door trim, and some historic doors, have been retained. Replacement finishes and trim are consistent with the historic fabric and with the style of the house.

6. Statement of significance:

#34 Hasell Street is a good example of a 19th century masonry Charleston single house. It retains integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association, and contributes to the significance of the Charleston Historic District. The property was rated as Category 3: Significant in the 1973 Feiss-Wright Inventory of Charleston. Category 3 is described as "Good architectural quality. Vernacular. Of less sophistication and refinement than "Excellent." Modest, appealing, curious, interesting. To be retained and protected."

Historical Background

The Ansonborough fire of April 1838 left much of the neighborhood in ruins. During the next few years, the area was gradually redeveloped with houses and small commercial building. A number of houses were built for resale or rental, but like the new owner-occupied dwellings, most were of masonry construction.

#34 Hasell Street is one of four very similar buildings. The size, lot placement, and detailing of 30, 32, 34, and 36 Hasell Street indicate they were built as a group.
