I was going through the Pinckney-Means papers today from the SC Historical Society, and they had a few shots you might want to make note of.

The photo of 8 South Battery was taken in about 1925 and shows the pool in the interior courtyard. There were a couple of photos showing 209 Ashley Ave. (which is what I was researching in the first place) from 1910-1915.

The kitchen house at 139 Tradd Street stood behind a wooden building that was relocated to Lenwood Blvd. in 1913 to make way for a new building at 139 Tradd. I suspect that the kitchen house was torn down then.

The photo of 30 Queen Street was dated Feb. 1930.

I just snapped these with my phone, but it would be good to have a handy reference since they are totally without any indexing at all at the library. Ugh.
