I rode by 124 Coming Street and that photo of the boy in the stroller device definitely shows that building. The details of the trim around the piazza door match, the form of the building match, and the view of St. Matthew's steeple matches too. I'd at least drop in a "likely" reference.

(b)-(e) of that third set are not in Hampton Park Terrace/Wagener Terrace. Or not all of them. The one at 199 is a likely 1930s or 1940s house, but there are only a very few streets that go as high as 199, and I can't find that one anywhere. I'm wondering if it might not even be in West Ashley or North Charleston. The mystery shots are likely south of Line Street somewhere, but no in Hampton Park/Wagener Terrace for sure. And 123 Coming is in Radcliffeborough.

Otherwise, those are good!

I'll drop by the originals next week along with four shots of the wharf area and a nice picture of 6-8 Chalmers too.
