

NUMBER FORTY-TWO CHURCH STREET c. 1898
Residence of Mr. Boykin Rose

Hidden in the bend of Church Street, this late 19th century house has a subtle Victorian flavor. The large panned windows, door hood and turned piazza columns combine to evoke a post Civil War design. A total renovation has recently been completed which serves to enhance the basic structure of the house with its high ceilings, gracious room proportions and wonderful light.

## ENTRANCE HALL

The rope molding seen throughout the rooms is an ornamental embellishment of the recent renovation. There is a pleasant flow throughout the main rooms and the trim helps to unify the space.

## LIVING ROOM

The owner and his late wife collected American furniture and paintings of the American Impressionist school. All the wood pieces with one exception represent that interest.

Clock, from the ancestral home on the Hudson River of the Janney family (Mrs. Rose's maiden name). It once hung in the Metropolitan Museum in New York City.

The tapestry inserts in the panel screen between the living room and the dining room represents work done c. 16th century.

## DINING ROOM

Pair marble-topped tables, Irish, Georgian style, flanking the window wall.

The remaining dining room pieces are American.

Many of the beautiful silver pieces seen throughout the house are horseracing trophies. The Mrs. Rose's family had a great interest in racing and horsebreeding.

## KITCHEN - FAMILY ROOM

The bright and inviting kitchen provides space above the cabinets to display Chinese exportware along with many cooper cooking pots and two garden-fresh pumpkins! The patterned floor is a painted design on wood.

The family room contains a mixture of pieces.

Ruffian is buried under the flagpole at Belmont Park.
