Old Charleston Is Model For New Gasoline Station

Adapting the charm of old Charleston to a highly modern use, ancient bricks caressed by the hand of time will be used in building a gasoline filling station in the colonial style at Wentworth street and Ashley avenue.

A new process for cleaning the old bricks of mortar so that they will have the appearance of genuine age, without the speckled white which has marred other attempts at duplication of old houses will be used in constructing the latest gasoline haven.

A peaked, sloping roof, slightly curved, and the low, rambling appearance of the old architecture will be carried out, while a five-foot brick wall at the rear will furnish the proper background.

Behind arched carriage gates will be the washracks and greasing pits, while the gasoline pumps will be placed on a concrete courtyard in front of the quaint house.

The gasoline station is being constructed by the Dawson Engineering company for the Economy Oil company. Both of these firms are Charleston owned and operated.
