My best guess is that it's 303-305 King Street, based on the Dixie/Budweiser sign projecting building (a Dixie Grill occupied 305 King according to *The Old Codgers' Charleston Address Book*); the fact that I'm pretty sure it's the same building as in [this photo](#); and that the building at the right is numbered 307. Sanborn Maps also indicate the "lay of the land," i.e., the "hyphen" (enclosed former piazza??) between the two buildings. See attached 1944 Sanborn Map.
