- Sanborn Map, 1902
 - shows floor plan of building (waiting room, storage room, offices, etc.), as well as location of accompanying train tracks in the building's north yard. What is interesting to note is that the dotted line extending north from the building is actually a covered platform for passengers – this is where the outside patio is today.
- Sanborn Map, 1944
 - Also shows floor plan of building
- *News and Courier*, May 1, 1950
 - Article documenting the building's association with late nineteenth and early twentieth century railroad companies. Confirms its use as a passenger depot for those arriving from and departing to Florence.

Brief Timeline, post Civil War

1881: *News and Courier*, August 24, 1881: There is a brief mention that the “current Northeastern Railroad passenger depot will be used for the storage of compressed cotton.”

1884-1888: Sanborn Fire Insurance Map does not detail the building but labels this property as the location of the Northeastern Railroad Depot.

1902: Sanborn Fire Insurance Map identifies the building as the Atlantic Coast Railroad Depot (see map attached).

1944-1955: Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps identify the building as a grocery warehouse. The former passenger waiting room is labeled as storage for “wholesale biscuits” (see 1944 map attached).
