

This index was begun by the Historic Charleston Foundation in the Fall of 1999 with major contributions during the summer of 2001. During this period some items have been moved, particularly the boxes or folders entitled "miscellaneous," for the purpose of being relocated to more appropriate and closely related boxes and folders.

Box #1 Slavery

Folder A: "Letters pertaining to the sale of slaves"

- Envelope: to "Hon" R. B. Rhett. Note that the following items in this folder appear to have been originally contained in this envelope. 1 Page.
- Letter: March 11, 1858; Charleston: to Langdon Cheves from R. B. Rhett concerning the death of a slave girl Caroline, and the physical condition of Moses, one of his former slave drivers, both recently sold to Cheves. The letter gives Rhett's account of the transport of the slaves for the purposes of trying to establish that Cheves should be financially responsible for the loss of the slave girl, rather than himself. Also discussion related to the slave Moses' claims that he is not physically able to work. Rhett assures Cheves that he was perfectly fit upon his sale to Cheves, and suggests that he is lying to keep from working. Mention of his son Edmund, his son Barnwell, Savannah, the Messrs Habersham, Mr. DeSaussure, Ashepoo, Mr. Lowry, Edmund Means, and Mr. Leath. 1 Page.
- Letter: March 12, 1858: to Mr. Alonzo White from R. B. Rhett concerning the death of the slave girl Carolina of syphilis shortly after her sale to Langdon Cheves. Rhett suggests that her pre-existing condition was unreasonably exacerbated by her overnight stay on the flat in the rain, from which it was the responsibility of Cheves to pick them up. Mention of Mr. Pringle Smith and the Savannah River. 1 Page.
- Letter: March 27, 1858; Savannah: to Langdon Cheves from John Ashby Wragg concerning the conditions of the slave girl Caroline to whom he attended previous to her death. 1 Page.
- Letter: February 25, 1858; "Deltree": to R. B. Rhett in Charleston from Langdon Cheves concerning the matter of the death of the slave girl Caroline and the professes inability of several of the slaves purchased from Rhett to work, including Moses and Hannah. Mention of Mr. DeSaussure, Dr. Wragg, Thomas Rhett, and slaves Marion and Peggy. 1 Page.
- Letter: February 24, 1858; St. Michael's Alley: to R. B. Rhett from illegible concerning the legal nuances of the death of the slave girl Caroline. 1 Page.
- Letter: February 23, 1858: illegible: testimonial from Dr. John Ashby Wragg as presented to Langdon Cheves on the matter of the death of the slave girl Caroline. Mention of Messrs Robert Habersham & Sons. 1 Page.
- Sketch: and description of the flat of Langdon Cheves on which R. B. Rhett's slaves were kept overnight in Savannah. 1 Page.
- Letter: February 12, 1858; Savannah: to R. B. Rhett from Langdon Cheves inquiring as to the possible time of arrival of slaves recently purchased by Cheves and explaining the reason for his failure to meet them. Mention of Mssrs Habersham & Son and Charleston. 1 Page.
- Letter: Tuesday, February 9, 1858: to Barnwell from Edmund Rhett regarding the negotiation of the sale of slaves to Langdon Cheves. Mention of "father," R. B. Rhett, Savannah, Darien, slaves Morris and Betsy, the latter "of Glasco's family," Mr. DeSaussure, Mr. White, and slaves Molly, Hagor, Sam and Philip. 2 Pages.
- List: February 13, 1858: of 31 slaves sold by R. B. Rhett to Langdon Cheves and associated charges. Slaves listed by name. 1 Page.

Folder B: "List of slaves owned by Governor William Aiken, 1864"

- List: of slaves owned by Governor William Aiken in 1864. Documents in the folder are typed transcripts from the originals. This document appears to have been originally attached to the Affidavit to the U. S. District Court listed below in Folder C. Multiple pages.

Folder C: "U. S. District Court document regarding slaves owned by William Aiken"

Affidavit: July 9, 1874; Charleston: to the U. S. District Court regarding the number of slaves owned by

William Aiken at the time of Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation and their respective values. Mention of Judge George S. Bryan, the Coal's Field Rail Road Company, North Eastern Rail Road Company, West Point Mills, Daniel Horbeck, and William Libby. Mention of particular slaves "who were of his [Aiken's] immediate household and in and about his family Tom & Ann Greggs and her son Henry Greggs, Sambo and his wife Dorcas Richardson and her children Charles, Rachael, Victoria, Elizabeth and Julia. Charles Jackson and Anthony Barnwell, and two carpenters Will and Jacob." The abovementioned list of slaves owned by William Aiken in 1864 appears to have been that list originally attached to this affidavit. 6 Pages.

Box #7 Civil War

Folder A: Poems: "Col. Alfred Rhett," and "Afraid to Die?" After 1889

- Poems: in or after 1890: by Holda Leigh entitled "Col. Alfred Rhett" and "Afraid to Die?" possibly prepared for funerary or memorial purposes. Mention of Sumter, and Elliott. 1 Page.

Folder B: Poem: "Charleston Retaken," Date unknown

- Poem: by Paul H. Hayne entitled "Charleston Retaken," describing the reclamation of Charleston from the British troops on December 14, 1882, following the surrender of Cornwallis. 1 Page.

Folder C: Miscellaneous documents pertaining to war

- Notice: for war veterans from New York to send their names for listing in a military "Roll of Honorable Service." 1 Page.
- Poem: about the Confederate flag. 1 Page.

- Letter: February 10th: Kensington: from Aunt Mattie to "My dear little boys" telling about the gift of a "donkey cart" from Cousin Richard to his children. 1 page.

Folder B: "Letters to 'Mr. Rhett' from various persons"

- Letter: January 12, 1900: from Louise Mazyck to "Mr. Rhett" explaining her absence from a ball the previous evening. 1 page.
- Letter: March 19, 1899: University of Virginia: from Louise J. Humphreys to "Mr. Rhett" accepting an invitation to a "geranau" to be held that August. 1 page.
- Letter: Wednesday: 27 Savage Street, Charleston, SC: from Ruby C. Gaillard to "Mr. Rhett" on the subject of his "decision," and the matter of the "Collige." Mention made of Rhett's impending vacation to Flat Rock. 1 page.
- Letter: Thursday morning: from Mary Roscoe Randolph to "Mr. Rhett" inviting him to take tea with herself and John Thomley. Mention made of Rhett's plantation. 1 page.
- Letter: May 31st: University of Virginia: from Betty Page Cooke to "Mr. Rhett" declining his invitation to the Ierueau¹. 1 page.
- Letter: 24 South Union Street: from Anne MacGregor Paylir of Rochester, NY, to "Mr. Rhett" thanking him for "seeing to the Domestic Science bills" for her, and telling him of her summer plans and occurrences. Mentions made of the Asheville School for Boys, Marblehead Bay, and a trip to Canada made by "Miss Lilli Smith" and "Mrs. Huger." 1 page.
- Letter: July 11th: Hillside: from illegible name to "Mr. Rhett" sending condolences for the death of Rhett's brother (apparently wounded in battle, presumably the Civil War). Also talk of war

news, including **President Davis'** desire to carry "the standard beyond the boundaries of the Confederacy." 1 page.

- Letter: from J. A. Marchbanks to "Mr. Rhett" regarding \$10 enclosed for payment on rent and a mule. 1 page.
- Letter: from May Mason to "Mr. Rhett" in explanation of a "surprise" of the night before, and an invitation to Rhett and a Mr. O'Brien to take dinner with her. Mention of further social engagements between the two. 1 page.
- Letter: from L. Philips Whaley to "Mr. Rhett" on the subject of various pleasantries. Mention made of Whaley's seemingly recent visit to Charleston, "Little Charlie," and Mr. Legare. Tone of the letter reflects a genuine affection and familiarity between the author and Mr. Rhett. 2 pages.
- Letter: from Jeannie S. Stone to "Mr. Rhett" inviting him to be her guest at her annual Christmas house party, to take place in New Orleans. Mention made of her sisters Miss Stone and Mrs. Perkins. 1 page.
- Letter: Newberry: from Anne Preston Konk to "Mr. Rhett" on various pleasantries. Author alludes to a comment in Rhett's previous letter to her of something that he wants to ask her, writing that she has a good idea of what it is but says that she will wait until she sees him in person to hear. Mention made of Rhett's impending trip to Asheville. Tone of the letter is intimate, playful and flirtatious. 3 pages.
- Letter: from Annie E. Snowden to "Mr. Rhett" thanking him for the roses that he sent to her on the anniversary of the death of "our dear one," also a friend of Rhett's. Mention made of Rhett's trip to the mountains. 1 page.
- Letter: from M. H. Martin to "Mr. Rhett" thanking him for the gift of fresh eggs. 1 page.
- Letter: Tuesday: from Mary Roscoe Randolph to "Mr. Rhett" thanking him for the pen he sent her for Christmas. Allusion made to some kind of recent sadness. Mention made of the Perkinsons. 1 page.
- Letter: Sunday: from Mary Roscoe Randolph to "Mr. Rhett" inviting him to dine with her and her mother. 1 page.

Folder C: "Letters to Edmund Rhett"

- Letter: September 25th: Bellevue: to "Master Edmund Rhett" from his brother Aiken concerning his "bantam" hen and her chicks. Mention made of Flat Rock. Tone, content, and vocabulary of the letter suggests that Aiken is a young boy. 1 page.
- Letter: Monday: to Edmund from his mother in response to Edmund's request for certain of his books to be sent to him. Mention is made of Aiken going to Jehossee, Mr. Whitehead, their poor rice crop, and a large reception for "Sis," presumably for her coming out. Mention is further made of Cousin Helen, Alicia, I'on, Georgetown, and Arthur Parker. 1 page.
- Letter: October 9th: Lakeside: to Edmund from his mother on the subject of Edmund's going to college (apparently in Virginia, although the particular school is not specified). Mention made of Helen, Cousin Helen, Mrs. O'Neil, Burnet, I'on, Poinsett and his promotion to "Sergeant Major," and Julie and B. in Alexandria. 1 page.
- Letter: April 28th: Charleston: to Edmund from his mother on various subjects. Mention made of Sis, "our cousin Mrs. Marsh," Mrs. Hitchcock, Cousin Cle, Helen, Walter, the "Society" event of the Spring - 'A Dance of All Nations,' the Simonds, Mrs. Alfred Rhett and her generous pay "for a woman," and Sallie Bowan and her son George. 1 page.
- Letter: January 27th: Charleston: to Edmund from his mother on the subject of the great financial hardship among planters, including herself, brought about by the poor rice market. Mention made of Jim, Jerry, Mr. Grimball, Mr. Fitzsimmons, Sis and Alicia, Julian Wells, and Jan Huger. 1 page.
- Letter: March 15th: Charleston: to Edmund from his mother giving news of home and entreating him to write soon. Mention made of the "horrible losses at Jehossee," Edmund's friend McGowan, Aiken and his friendship with Mayor Courtney's son Campbell, the illness of Edmund's grandmother, Aunt Mattie, Siss, and Marie Hostie. 1 page.
- Letter: December 29th: Charleston: to "Dear boy" from his mother extending a motherly warning not to go out without his cardigan. Mention made of Jerry and Aiken. 1 page.

Folder D: "Letters to Henrietta Rhett Maybank from *Bino Bulow* (Mrs. Joseph)"

- Letter: Monday Afternoon: **40 Coming Street**: to **Harriett** from **Bino Bulow** accepting Harriett's offer to wait at her table (apparently for some kind of event). Mention made of **Clare**. 1 page.
- Letter: October 31st: **St. James Parish**: to **Etta (Mrs. A. Burnet Rhett)** in **Flat Rock** from her sister **Claude** on various topics including the possibility of Etta procuring a "French woman" in New Orleans to take care of "Heart, & the baby." Mention made of **Elise, Mr. and Mrs. Aiken** returning from **New York**, **Burnet**, **Mr. Scanlan**, "so quiet & gentlemanly in his manners that I think he can not be a Yankee," **Sallie**, and **Marguerite**. 1 page and 1 envelope.
- Letter: **March 22nd, 1883: Fort Alsimaboine, XX**: to **Dr. Teague** from **Keatie Re. Paul** on the subject of indian (Native American) "curiosities" and a position open at **Fort Benton** for a dentist. Mention made of **Lame Bull**, chief of the Sioux nation, and **Mrs. Teague**. 1 page.

Folder E: "Letters to I'on Rhett from Nellie P. Elliott"

- Letter: Monday afternoon: from **Nellie S. Elliott** to **I'on L. Rhett** at 63 Broad Street thanking him for the box of candy. 1 page.

Folder F: "Letters to I'on Rhett - Frances Dill Rhett"

- Letter:² to **Frances** from **Frances**³ in California on various subjects. Mention of **Mary Lee** (or Lu) and son **Noland**, **Sequoia Park**, the **San Francisco Fair**, "mother," the **Battle of Flanders**, **Bill Lee**, **New Orleans**, **Julia and Pauline**, and **Mr. Rhett**. Note the commentary on radio programming: "Isn't it amazing how the radio is contributing to a well-informed public!" Note also very interesting commentary on the War, apparently then going on only in Europe, as well as humorous musings on family ancestry. 2 pages.
- Letter: to **Frances** from **Frances**⁴ in New Orleans on various topics. Mention is made of **San Francisco** and the **American Library Association Convention**, **Julia and Pauline**, **Hitler**, political figures **Long** and **Hersey** of Louisiana, **Mary Lee** and **Harvey**, and **Charles and Paul**. Note the most interesting commentary on Hitler and the idolization of him by the German people. 2 pages.
- Letter: Sunday evening: to "**Miss Frances**" from **I'on L. Rhett** apologizing for not coming to call upon her on the "Island." Mention of a recent storm, or "midsummer blow." Stationary from the **Carolina Yacht Club**, Charleston, SC. 1 Page.
- Letter: to "**My Dear I'on**" from unknown. Manuscript is largely illegible and appears to be incomplete. 3 Pages.
- Letter: Tuesday: invitation to **I'on** from **MAK**. Mention of **#97 Meeting Street**. 1 Page.
- Letter: to **I'on** from **Joe** asking for I'on to meet him for a few minutes in the morning so that they may speak before Joe's departure for **Boston** at noon. Stationary from **Dr. Harold A. Foster, The Glenmore**, 7th Avenue and 55th Street, Telephone 358 **Columbus**. 2 Pages.
- Letter: "**H-ville, N.C.**": to **I'on** from **Aiken** asking I'on to make some arrangements for him. Mention of two grey clocks, **R. B. Mills**, and **Philadelphia**. 1 Page.
- Letter: December 28th: **Toronto**, Canada: to **I'on** from **Eureva Wallace** on a variety of familiar subject. Mention of **Toronto**, **Charleston**, "the dear old **Island**," "Mother," **Campbell**, "the Club," and **Mary Street**. Stationary is from **The Elliott**, Toronto, Canada. 2 Pages.
- Letter: June 23rd: **Flat Rock, NC**: to **I'on** from **Alicia** on various pleasantries and news from Flat Rock. Mention of **Aunt C**, **Joe**, **Nellie**, and **Columbia**. Manuscript is largely illegible. 1 Page.
- Letter: **Pine Forest Inn, Summerville, SC**: to **I'on** from **Marguerite Roman** on the subject of purchasing tickets to an event. Mention of **Mr. George Meed**, **Burnet**, **Aunt Claude**, and **Aunt Etta**. Manuscript largely illegible. 1 Page.
- Letter: May 19th: **Charleston**: to "Dearest boy" from his "affectionate **Mother**" on the subject of money and news of friends and family in Charleston. Mention of **West Point Mill**, **Miss Sloan**,

Miss Bell, Sis, the Citadel Cadets, Eugene Jersey, West Point, Mr. Whitehead, Irving Jimmy (or Irving, Jimmy), Harry Millor, Grace Church, Aiken, Aunt Sue, the mountains, and Cousin Helen. 1 Page.

- Letter: Monday night: to "My darling boy" from his mother on the temptations of the University life to which is about to be exposed, advising him to draw upon God for strength to resist evil. 1 Page.

Folder G: "Letters to Burnet Rhett"

- Letter: Monday: Flat Rock: to Burnet from unknown⁵ on miscellaneous news of family and friends, including a "grand dinner" attended by Papa and his company, and President and Mrs. Hayes. Mention of "the little girls," old Rhodes, Miss Dr. King, "the Dr.," Jones, Read's house, the Mill, and Sallie. 1 Page.
- Letter: February 1st: Charleston, South Carolina: a fascinating letter written in French to Burnet from C. Rhett⁶, in response to his letter in French to her, with news from family and friends in Charleston. Note a particularly interesting passage on an article that C. Rhett has written on Charleston in 1780, demonstrating that the colony was English and not Huguenot "as is the mode of pretense as of late." Mention of I'on, Harriot, Mrs. Beckman, Mr. Tom Pinckney, Julie, Charlottesville (chars-de-ville), Mrs. Ethel Dawson, Mr. Barry, Anna, Mr. duPont, Marie, Chicora, Sullivan's Island (l'isle de Sullivan), Frances Lewis, Robbie, Edmond, artifacts of General Beauregard at the Museum of the Confederate Dames (Musée des damme Confédére), Charleston. 2 Pages.
- Letter: June 22, 7:30pm: Windsor: to Burnet from Sallie I'on Lowndes on the subject of Cousin Etta's illness. Mention of I'on, Aunt E - - il, Atlanta, Lowry National Bank, and Harriett. 1 Page.
- Letter: Thursday: to Burnet from Sallie I'on Lowndes inviting him to make arrangements to see her before she leaves on Saturday. 1 Page.
- Letter: Wednesday: 8 King Street: to Burnet from Anna W. Marshall inviting him to take tea with her the following evening before she leaves that following Wednesday the 13th. Mention of Alex at the office. 1 Page.

Folder H: "Letter to Burnet Rhett (son of Henrietta Aiken Rhett) from his brother I'on"

- Letter: Blacksburg: December 8⁷: to Burnet from "Your aff'ate brother I." on the subject of various social sundries. Mention of Aunt Elise, Uncle Dick, Aunt Sue, Sammy, Mamma, Lipscomb⁸, the Hasties, Arthur Parker, Tillman, Williamson from Darlington, "Ben," Miss Minn, Mrs. Foster, Robbie Johnson, and Chestnut. 1 Page.

Folder I: "Letter to Miss Harriett Rhett, 1880s-1890s, 1886-1896"

- Letter: March 24, 1886: Greenville, SC⁹: to Miss Rhett from E. Capers critiquing her story entitled "the Summer in Faisvall" Mention of Abbeville, May, Miss Murfree¹⁰, Mr. & Mrs. Lewis, and Ms. Capers. 2 Pages.
- Letter: March 17, 1890: Citadel: to Miss Rhett from A. L. Humphreys requesting permission to call upon her the following Friday evening, the 21st. 1 Page.
- Letter: January 12, 1893: 172 Broad Street: to Miss Rhett from Elizabeth Potter Lemirens making excuses for having missed the lecture and asking her forgiveness. 1 Page.
- Letter: August 6, 1893: Hygeia Hotel, Fortress Monroe, VA¹¹: to Miss Rhett from Charles L.

Hussey from aboard the ship "Charleston" on the subject of hoping to hear from her, on the destination of the ship, and on various other sundries. Mention of sending Miss Rhett buttons to show her "good intention." Mention of New Hampshire, the "Washington Post," Charleston, the Rendez-vous¹², Rio, Barbadoes, West India, Montevideo, Valparaiso, Callao, Peru, and Miss Gaillard. 3 Pages.

- Letter: October 13, 1896: Flat Rock: to Harriet from Julia Taylor Hastie on behalf of Marie declining Harriet's invitation to be a bridesmaid on the 5th of November due to the fact that she has not been feeling well, and being prone to colds would not want to wear a thin dress in the evening. 1 Page.

Folder J: "Letters to Edmund Rhett from various persons, 1889-1907."

- Letter: January 26, 1889: Edisto Island: to Mister Edmund Rhett from Hector Williams on the subject of the care of Edmund's dogs and the sale of his own dog Nelly. Mention of "Mr. Rhett your brother," Mr. Hatch, Julius, Mr. Whitehead, Note that the author of the letter shows poor penmanship, spells phonetically, refers to Edmund and his peers as "Mr." and describes himself as Edmund's "servant." 1 Page.
- Letter: November 20, 1889: Charleston, SC¹³: to Bunnie from Willie Stoner introducing "Mr. Frank Dothage." Note that the stationary has an image of the office of James F. Redding at 59 Broad Street. 1 Page.
- Letter: January 16, 1902: Lucknow: to Bunny from Thomas W. Levering about Mr. Levering's recent trip to Egypt and Bombay. Mention of Bob, John Robinson, Miss Martha, the University, Hi, Rooster, California, Leland Stanford University, Taj Mahal, Hong Kong, and Japan. 2 Pages.
- Letter: January 26, 1889: Edisto Island: to Mister Edmund Rhett from Hector Williams on the subject of the care of Edmund's dogs and the sale of his own dog Nelly. Mention of "Mr. Rhett your brother," Mr. Hatch, Julius, Mr. Whitehead, Note that the author of the letter shows poor penmanship, spells phonetically, refers to Edmund and his peers as "Mr." and describes himself as Edmund's "servant." 1 Page.

- Letter: September 23, 1891: Columbia, SC: to Edmund Rhett in Flat Rock, NC from James Woodrow of the University of South Carolina regarding Edmund's request to take special courses and his completion in the "Mechanical Department." 1 Page.
- Letter: September 30, 1891: South Carolina College: to Dr. James M. Eacuitt at the University of Virginia from F. C. Woodward recommending Edmund Rhett for special courses and mentioning briefly the "new College." 1 Page.
- Receipt: October 29, 1891: Charleston, SC: to Edmund Rhett from Hankel & Co. for a check from Mrs. H. A. Rhett to him in the amount of \$212.00. 1 Page.

Fraternity and Taylor's various social activities and interactions in Raleigh. Mention also of "Tau" and "Alpha," Bell & Frank Darby, Norman Pike, Miss Maigie Bushee, Taylor's engagement to Miss Cordon, the Raleigh Capital Club, XXX Du Tour, Hendersonville, Oxford, NC, and Atlanta. 2 Pages.

- Card: Larry W. Boyd, Washington, DC. 1 Page.
- Post Card: to Captain Edmund Rhett from H. W. C. requesting that Edmund sail with them in an upcoming race. 1 Page.

When your little No. 3 comes, think of all the sewing...the price of Helen's was \$25."

About twelve years ago my sister gave it back to me, and as her children had given it rather rough usage, I took it to Wilkes-Barre and had it rebound. Since then it has had better usage, and for fear you would not know it in its new garb, I will send the old cover along with it.

About a year ago while in Pittsburgh, I met an old Army friend, H. Holland, and in talking over Army life he mentioned Winnsboro, and said that he had some things taken from there that he would like to restore to their owners. I then told him the story of the book and I suppose it was through him you found it.

I am sorry I cannot help you find the silver. I remember that there was a lot of silver buried there, near a house and that it was guarded by our soldiers, but whether they were Ohio or Pennsylvania soldiers I cannot remember.

If I attend the reunion of my Regiment at Gettysburg next Summer I will mention it there..."
