



Timeline for Nathaniel Russell House Garden: 1956 – 2010

1956 Article in the *News and Courier* mentioning Loutrel Briggs' work in the Russell House garden.

1967 - 1970 Landscape plans are designed by Loutrell Briggs and feature a geometric bed in the area of the kitchen house.

1977 Four landscape designs were drawn by Donald Parker, FASLA, from Williamsburg, Virginia. These designs, based on historic gardens in Virginia, featured “fancy grounds” that were positioned to the south of the side bay of the house. None were implemented.

1981 Rudy Favretti designs a landscape plan for the garden which was implemented. This is the design of the current garden.

1988 Mary Zahl sketches a design of the existing garden. This sketch includes the addition of plant material and garden features, some of which were implemented, including the footpath along south wall.
