Went to Brighton - suffering
very much with Neuralgia - spent
Sunday -
Monday 7th drove to New Haven
I took Steamers for Dieppe - a
sea bathing place - very comforta-
ble at the Hotel & amused among
the country people -
Tuesday 8th Took the train for
Paris - drove into Hotel du
Louvre with a reasonable
quantity of Trunks - distributed
in three Carriages - Hotel very
magnificent & comfortable
also - spent two days - disappointed
in not getting a pencil portrait - saw

& Public buildings - saw Mr
Wright our Minister - had
the honor to make the acquaintance

Tuesday 23rd Left for Leipzig
- lodged at Hotel de Blo-
gnes an immense & curious

den - put up at Hotel Belle-

arrived on Saturday at 5
o'clock & took baggage
at Borgo Vittoria -
Constantly bad weather, make-
ing it very difficult for ex-
cursions - the first three days
spent at Vieste / Bonifacio -
for Phaepe had a pretty good
day - missed the Sani bank

Cassimacristi - only tolerable.
For Uranus the first part
of the day good, but after-
wards clouded over, & at the
time of ascending the cone
very dark & hot from the quan-
tity of smoke -

Part of the excursion to Bai-
ae very beautiful, but too
many objects crowded together
making it a great fatigue.
The Temple of Jupiter (seepis
under water) is very curious.
The Sun shone out at
Pozzuoli making the Bay
very beautiful - in the
temple of Mercury the
People insisted upon saving
the Yarrantica, but they were
so dirty & disagreeable that I gave up.

the object was any thing but
pleasant - in this temple the
choir was very curious - the
Piscina Mirabilis is a grand &
beautiful work - there much
disappointed after our hard
work to find nothing fit to
eat at the Inn & so dirty.
