



HUCKS' FINISHED—One of Charleston's boarding-house landmarks, Hucks Cafeteria and Boarding House, met the axe last week. The house, at 74 Society, had been a rooming house in recent years. As Hucks' Cafeteria, it was well known to Lowcountry South Carolinians visiting Charleston prior to World War II. Mrs. Catherine Hucks, who operated it, was known to "set a fine table".
