Moore Started as a cooperage at 8 George Street W.A. *Moore Moore Drums, Inc* furnished wooden barrels and croaker sacks (the burlap bags that replaced barrels for storing flour and sugar). The plant being close to waterfront was ideal for serving the shipping traffic of the early days. One Old Codger remembers seeing the big wagons, loaded with wooden barrels and pulled by dray horses being driven through the streets. In 1942 the company began reconditioning steel drums and in 1951 the company relocated to their present location on Industrial Avenue the site of one of Charleston's original plantations.
