Wrought iron gates of a splendid mansion shield an exquisitely restored carriage house, set in a walled garden. Staying here, in the midst of the Historic District, the

guest may sample the leisurely pace and the sense of history of Charleston, attended by a courtesy of service.



THE MANSION and CARRIAGE HOUSE at 20 South Battery were built by Samuel Stevens in 1845. Twenty-five years later, the property was transformed into an architectural fashion plate of the times by Colonel Richard Lathers. The retired millionaire had returned to the South to help rebuild the state. He hoped the house would serve "as a meeting place for men of good will, from both the North and the South." The mansion is now the home of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Gay, Jr., who have carefully restored the ground floor and carriage house to accommodate the discerning Charleston visitor.

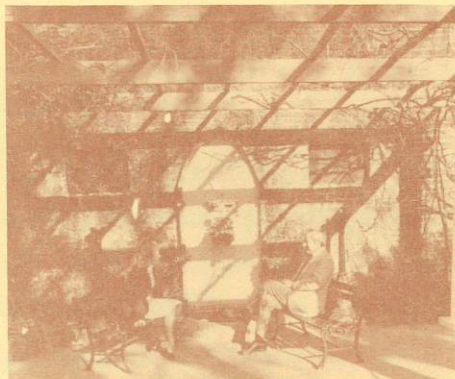




THE TEN UNITS of the Battery Carriage House have been gracefully adapted for contemporary comfort. Each room contains color television and stereo radio, as well as a totally equipped, concealed kitchenette.
