Julian Beattie Friday of 1713 McLeod St., Laurel Park, one of the organizers of the Shrine Bowl football game held annually in Charlotte, died Saturday at a local hospital.

Funeral services were held today at Stuhr's Chapel. Burial was in Bethany Cemetery.

Mr. Friday was born June 30, 1892, at Greenville, a son of David Dulin Friday and Mrs. Rosamond Happold Friday. He was a members of Second Presbyterian Church. He was a retired chemical salesman.

Mr. Friday was a member of St. Davids Lodge 72, AFM, Dalcho Consistory of Charleston, a 32nd Degree Scottish Rite Mason and a past potente and life member of Omar Temple of Charleston. He held honorary memberships in three other Shrine temples.

He was a charter member of the Cabiri International Order of Past Potentates Assn. and a past president of the Charleston chapter of Cabiri. He was a member of Loyalty Chapter 136, Order of the Eastern Star and had been a member of the Agricultural Society of S. C.
