- The second floor front best room contains a mantel with a fretwork frieze typical of houses in the immediate area.

- John Fullerton, who built several fine houses for others, built this one for himself around 1772. Fullerton was one of the "Sons of Liberty," who met in Mazyck's pasture in 1766 to celebrate the repeal of the Stamp Act.
