**134** 1970 thru 1999 Zion Olivet Presbyterian Church and Daycare *Zion Olivet Presbyterian Church* began in 1847 as a mission of the Second Presbyterian Church led by the Rev. John B. Adger, who had served 11 years as a missionary to Asia Minor. Members first met in the Second Presbyterian's lecture room on Society Street. In 1850, a building was constructed on Anson Street (see 95 Anson Street) that later became St. John's Reformed Episcopal Church. By 1858, attendance had grown so that a large building was erected on Calhoun Street with the name Zion Presbyterian Church. Olivet Presbyterian began as a mission in a chapel on George Street, and was organized as a separate congregation in 1879. Zion and Olivet merged in 1959. **135** 1970 thru 1996 Apartments 1901 thru 1960 Hospital and Training School for Nurses *One of the most interesting buildings on the street is this one at 135 Cannon which for more than half a century was the hospital and training school for black nurses. Founded by Dr. Alonzo C. McClennan in 1896, the idea grew out of his frustrated attempts to secure practical training for black nurses at other schools in the area. Alma DeCosta Banks was named the hospital's first head nurse when it opened its doors. She later became superintendent of nurses and served the hospital for 32 years. The hospital stayed open for 62 years, finally closing its doors in 1959 when the McClennan Banks Hospital opened in its place on Courtenay Drive. The brick building with its interesting half-octagon turreted facade received a historical marker in 1991 to commemorate its training of black nurses and service to the black community.*
