Mills: Statistics: page 391- "The site of C. divided into a a number of peninsulas, by creeks and marshes, which indented it on three sides, so as to leave but little unbroken high land in the middle. The first buildings extended along East Bay-street, and had a marsh in their whole front. A considerable creek, named Vanderhorst's Creek, occupied the foundation of Water Street, and passing beyond Meeting-street, sent out a branch to the northward, nearly to the present site of the first presbyterian church. Another creek stretched northwestwardly, nearly parallel to East Bay-street, from the neighborhood of Mc Cleod's lots, (the Battery) through Longitude Lane and north of it. The same kind of low grounds wa ran up Queen_s street(then called Dock Street) beyond the French church, and through Beresford Alley tall it approached eeting-street. The north end of Union, now State-street, was was planted with rice about the end of the eighteenth century. Another very large creek occupied the site of the present eentral market, and extended westwardly beyond "eeting -stre式 , then diverging southwardly almost to the independent church and spreading extensively to the northwest, and throwing off a branch to the northeast, so as to cover a large portion of ground.
