

Music Sets Tour

An afternoon of music and history will highlight the Charleston Symphony Orchestra Women's Association house tour Thursday from 3 to 5 p.m.

Once the rectory of St. Michael's Episcopal Church, 22 Lamboll St. was built circa 1830. The home of Mrs. H.J. Slocum features a drawing room with French chandelier from Haiti. Charles Stilwell and Victor Lawson, members of the orchestra, will play French horn duets in the formal garden adjoining the house.

Winter and summer drawing rooms complement each other at 6 Gibbes St., residence of Dr. and Mrs. Grant Patton. Built in 1816, the house features mantels of Carrera marble. Marilyn Curry, violinist, will perform in the winter drawing room, accompanied by pianist Hazel Cooper.

Tea will be served at the Robert Fenwick Giles House, 2 Gibbes St. The home of Dr. And Mrs. Fletcher Derrick dates to 1850 and has large, high-ceilinged rooms and a formal rose garden.

Mr. and Mrs. Felix C. Pelzer built their house at 11 Legare St. in 1973. The structure was designed to blend with its historic surroundings.

A string quartet consisting of Claire Libet, Emilia Cedel, Ruth Goldsmith and Elaine Colprit will perform at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Gay Jr., 20 South Battery. Built in 1843 and remodeled in 1870, the house features a mansard roof and semi-oval staircase.

Tickets for the tour are on sale at the Bicentennial Garden on Meeting Street and the symphony office, 3 Chisolm St. They will also be available at the houses the day of the tour.
