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I HATE using library catalogs on line. They are all terrible. Really. I have never even once found any single catalog to be useful in tracking down anything that is not a book being search for by its title.

These are two photos in the Clifton Johnson (photographer) collection of photos housed by that Amherst Jones Library. I can't reproduce the search that I did to find them. But one is 54 Meeting Street in about 1905 and one is the Market. The house at 54 Meeting Street was reworked in the early 20th century, but I'm 95% certain it is 54 Meeting.
