In December of 1989 the entire inventory valued at around \$100,000 was seized by a Drug Strike Force alleging that the inventory was purchased with profits from illegal drug sales. The inventory was sold at auction with the county and state receiving part of the funds from the auction. Western films and serials were shown each week and were main attractions. When silent movies ended in 1950, the theater was converted to *The Cameo Theater* film house. In that same year fire damaged the building and it was razed to make way for stores. When the Majestic closed, the News and Courier said in an editorial: "The Majestic had seen its best days and the Italian tenors seemed out of place on the screen where Ruth Roland, William S. Hart, Wally Reid, Dustin Farnum, Theda Bara and the other greats had performed. As the rubble falls before the workmen's sledges, the ghosts of these performers and patrons will be groping up the aisle and the sound of plaster under the wrecker's heels will crunch like the squashing of the peanut hulls." **1900** Home-Made Candy Co / Thomas Tundas
