Repairs to Start Soon on Building At 24 Broad St.

Repairs are to begin soon on the office building at 24 Broad street, formerly occupied by Mullally, Rivers & Lowndes, real estate and insurance agency. A few months ago an automobile got out of control and ran over the sidewalk, striking the front wall. The front of the building began to sag. The real estate firm moved into the Peoples building.

Plans for the repairs and remodeling were drawn by Simons & Lapham, architects. The contract was awarded to Charleston Constructors, Inc., for \$24,789.

The old cast iron front was rendered unsafe by the accident, so it will be removed and replaced with a stucco-covered brick front, with arched openings in the lower floor and tall square windows in the upper. The front will be simple and neat to conform with Charleston traditions.

The building will be completely air conditioned and a central heating plant installed. A main public office and two private offices will be on the ground floor. The general office and space for the special functions of the company will be upstairs. A fireproof record vault and modern rest rooms will be included.
