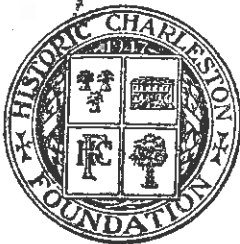
Will you please sign both of these receipts and return one to us for our files in the stamped addressed envelope enclosed?

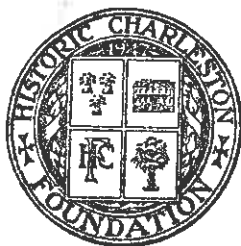

ITEMS:

- 73.2.1 Photograph (unframed) of phosphate drain by Dowling c. 1910. Dimensions: $7 \frac{3}{8}$ " x $9 \frac{3}{4}$ ". Mat 11" x 14".
- 73.2.2 Pen and brown ink wash drawing of Drayton Hall according to family tradition prior to building of same. (edges of drawing torn and frayed). Fragmented paper approx. $9 \frac{5}{8}$ " x $19 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Brown wood frame approx. 12" x $22 \frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 73.2.3 List of slaves at Drayton Hall, October 1822: Signed F.G. (?) Dellesseline. List $9 \frac{3}{4}$ " x $14 \frac{3}{4}$ ". Frame - blackwood - $10 \frac{5}{8}$ " x $15 \frac{5}{8}$ ".
- 73.2.4 Water color said to be of plantation on Kiawah. Gazebo (temple?) tower left, house in center, with flankers and buildings (6 in all). Painting dimensions: $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $11 \frac{7}{8}$ ". Frame of brown wood: $10 \frac{1}{4}$ " x $14 \frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 73.2.5 Photograph of Drayton Hall (land side) showing 2 brick flankers, done by Cook, who worked in Charleston during the Civil War and shortly thereafter. Photograph 7" x 9". Frame (handcarved?) brown wood, 10" x 12".
- 73.2.6 Photograph of pond at Drayton Hall c. 1910 by Dowling. Photograph $7 \frac{3}{4}$ " x $9 \frac{5}{8}$ ". Oak frame 12" by 15", with decorative beaded edge, beading broken and missing in places.
- 73.2.7 Photograph of Drayton Hall garden c. 1910. Dimensions: $7 \frac{3}{8}$ " x $9 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Oak frame 12" x 15".
- 73.2.8 Photograph of big oak tree at Drayton Hall, showing covered gate at left, by Dowling c. 1910 - duplicate of 73.2.9. Photograph dimensions: $7 \frac{1}{4}$ " x 10". Oak frame $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $15 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Frame is beaded on inner edge. There is NO GLASS IN THIS FRAME.
- 73.2.9 Photograph of big oak tree at Drayton Hall, showing covered gate at left by Dowling c. 1910. Photograph dimensions $7 \frac{1}{4}$ " x $9 \frac{3}{4}$ ". Frame oak, 12" x 15".
