

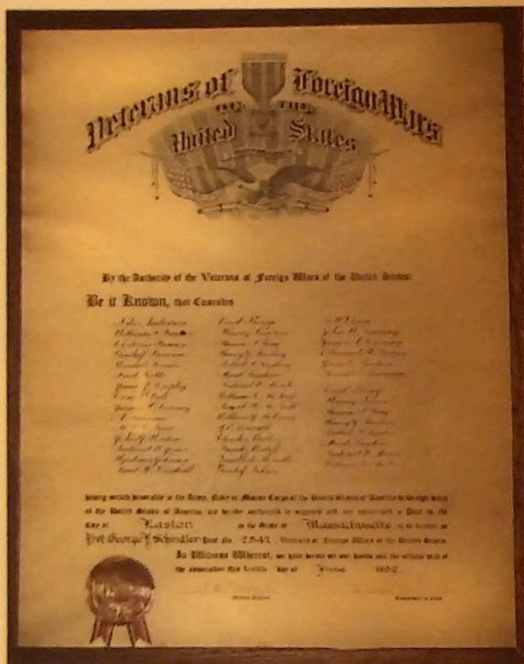

History of Private George F. Schindler
Post 2547 of Easton, Massachusetts
Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States

April, 1932: Harry Lawson, James Downey, and Harold Boudreau contacted all veterans eligible in Easton to become members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

May, 1932: Met in McMenemy's Market and named the Post the Private George Francis Schindler Post 2547 of North Easton, Massachusetts, to meet the first Friday in each month, and elected officers for the ensuing year. Private George Francis Schindler was born in Easton on April 8, 1896. Private Schindler was killed on July 18, 1918 at Belleau Woods, France. He was 22 years old. He was the second man from Easton killed in action during World War I. Private Schindler's body was returned to Easton and a military funeral was held at the Frothingham Memorial Hall on Barrows Street. He is buried in St. Mary's Cemetery on Canton Street, North Easton, MA.

May 24, 1932: It was voted to send a letter of thanks to Frank McMenemy for giving us the use of his vacant store.

June 3, 1932: Held meeting at Legion Quarters.

June 9, 1932: Mustering in of Post. Met in Memorial Hall, North Easton. Mustered in Commander Irving B. Mowrey, only surviving member of the G.A.R. in Easton, as an honorary member, and installed the following officers, with Henry Williams as installing officer, assisted by Walter Sullivan, both from David Adams Post 611 of Taunton:
