And is not old England grown new?

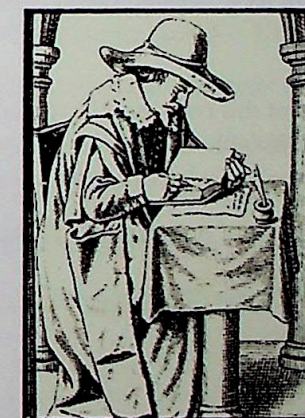
