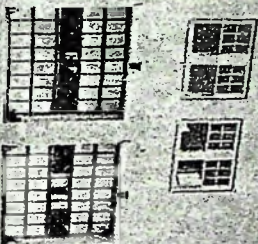

stable when the town filed and appropriated the sum of \$4500 at the town meeting in March, this sum being used to purchase the land and the cost of material used in the construction. The labor was paid for at the civil works administration at the federal emergency relief administration. This project afforded work for masons, carpenters and laborers during the late winter and spring months.

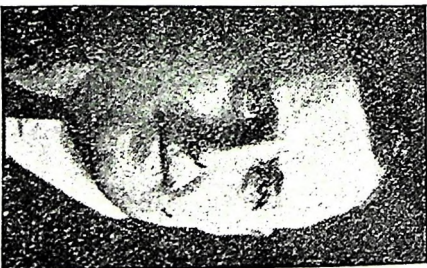
fire department who was then Danie Lordan and who served the North-Easton village district in a worthy and profitable manner.
