ESTENOZ SAYS HE WILL CONTINUE WAR REGARDLESS OF UNCLE SAM

Black Rebel Evidently Is
Looking For a Very
Severe Spanking

FLEET WILL ARRIVE TODAY

Rear Admiral Osterhaus
on Flagship Washington
Due This Morning

Santiago, Cuba, May 29.—General Estenoz, who has declared his intention to carry on the war regardless of whether the United States intervenes until the Morau law is repealed. This law provides that there shall be no recognition of political parties on racial lines offensive to the negroes.

The coffee plantation belonging to Jua Botta, a German subject, near El Cobre, ten miles west of here, was destroyed today by the rebels. The buildings were burned and cattle carried away. A protest has been lodged with the German consul.

The U. S. Cruiser Washington, flagship of the Atlantic fleet with Rear Admiral Osterhaus in command, will arrive in Key West this morning, and will probably be followed a few hours later by the rest of the fleet. It is not thought that all of the ships will come into the inner harbor, although several of them will. Pilot Oscar Clifton was notified yesterday to meet the fleet and to pilot her safely into the harbor. The fleet will rendezvous here until further orders from Washington. The battleship Nebraska will move to the outer harbor this morning. By nightfall the entire Atlantic fleet is expected to be at anchor here.

In conclusion Mr. Boozer asserts that it is unsafe for a man who weighs only 125 pounds to live with Mrs. Boozer.

TEDDY ASKS HADLEY TO ACT AS CHAIRMAN

In the Event Roosevelt
Forces Get Control of
the Convention

Jeffers City, Mo., May 29.—In a letter received by Governor Herbert S. Hadley here today, Colonel Theodore Roosevelt asked him to be temporary chairman of the Republican National Convention to be held in Chicago if the Roosevelt forces succeed in getting control of the convention.

Mr. Hadley will accept if he believes he can best serve his faction of the party, it was announced, but he would greatly prefer that some other progressive be selected for the place. He so told the Colonel in a letter in answer to his request.

Governor Hadley was one of the eight governors who wrote to Colonel Roosevelt asking him to become a candidate for president when the Colonel announced he would accept. The letter received from Colonel Roosevelt today is the first intimation that Governor Hadley is Roosevelt's personal choice for the place.

PRICE OF BEEF REACHED IT'S HIGH WATER MARK

Price in Wholesale Markets of
New York Was Highest
Since 1882

New York, May 29.—The highest price since 1882 was reached by beef in the wholesale markets here today, when it sold at 13 7/8 cents a pound in bulk. It is stated to mean from 1 1/2 to 2 cents a pound increase for prime meats at retail. The primary cause of the high prices, the wholesale men say, is the continued scarcity of cattle.

UNDERWOOD ROOTERS COMING TO BALTIMORE

Enthusiastic Georgians Are
Going With Three Brass
Bands in June

Atlanta, Ga., May 29.—A thousand loyal Georgians, filled with Underwood enthusiasm, will march on Baltimore to storm the town and the Democratic convention, and seek by bubbling spirits to drown the hopes of the opposing candidates.

With three brass bands and a drum and fife corps they will wake the echoes of the Maryland city, and from a thousand lusty throats, the name of Underwood and the immortal words of "Dixie" will be sent to the skies.

Fifteen hundred marchers from Birmingham and a throng of delegations from other cities of the state will join the crowds that hail the democratic leader at the Baltimore convention.

All Sections Represented.
The thousand loyal Georgians will be largely men from Atlanta, but the party will comprise delegations from all parts of the fifth district. Other sections of the state, particularly Savannah, Macon and Augusta will also send parties to join in the general acclaim of Georgia's choice for the presidency.

CONFEDERATE MONEY TO BE DISTRIBUTED

Secretary of Treasury
Willing to Send It to
Educational Institutions

Washington, D. C., May 29.—Thousands of dollars of Confederate money stored in the treasury may be distributed to educational institutions. Senator Shively of Indiana, who has received several such requests from different points in Indiana, took the matter up with the secretary of the treasury today and he expressed a willingness to send numerous samples where requests are properly made out.

Some Brazilian Territory
Under Germany

UNCLE SAM LOOK SHARP

Navy League of the United
States Urges Congress to
Build Ships

Washington, May 29.—Germany's naval building program and suggestion that an attempt may be made to place under the German flag many thousands of square miles of land in Brazil controlled by German nationals, are submitted to members of Congress in a letter from the Navy League of the United States, urging reconsideration of the House's refusal to make an appropriation for battleships this year.

Attention is also called to the building program of Japan, and it is declared that while both that country and Germany are most friendly with the United States, "it would be most foolish if we failed to consider them as possible opponents."

The letter directs particular attention to attacks upon the Monroe Doctrine appearing in German publications. One of these urged Germany to "closely examine whether things resting on such shallow legal and historical foundations as the Monroe Doctrine need be tolerated or whether, at the bottom, they are not merely American arrogance which requires sharp and decisive opposition."

MRS. SPARKMAN DIED IN TAMPA MONDAY

Estimable Lady Passed
Peacefully Away After
Long Illness

Answering the call of the Death Angel, the spirit of Mrs. Mary Ellen Sparkman, the beloved wife of Hon. Stephen M. Sparkman, Congressman for this district of Florida, took flight into eternity yesterday afternoon at 12:25, relieving her from the suffering she has endured since last September. As the end came her pain ceased and she peacefully passed away, surrounded by all the members of the grief stricken family.

Only a month has passed since Mrs. Sparkman was brought home from Baltimore where she was operated on in the hope that she would receive relief. The effort was futile.

Last September it first became known that Mrs. Sparkman's life was in danger and she was hurried to Johns-Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore. The first of two operations was then performed. Two months later she was brought back home, where she remained until last March. She was again taken to the famous hospital several weeks later, remaining there until her return home for the last time.—Tampa Tribune.

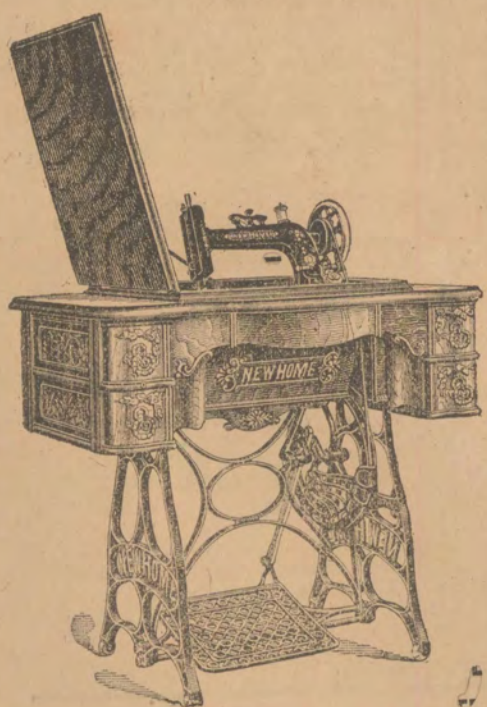

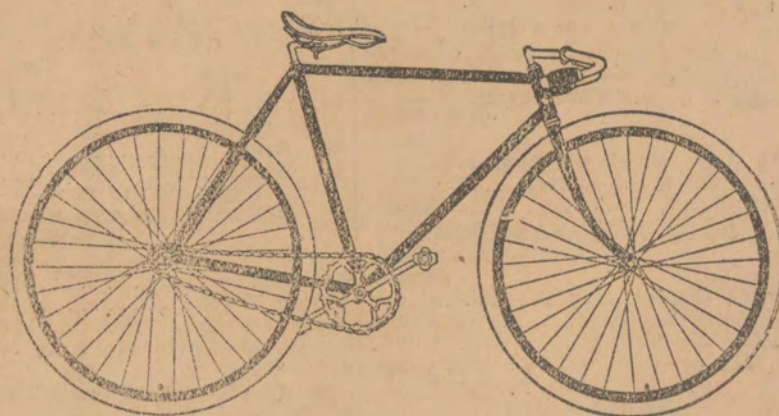
