BIG PROJECT

To Induce Immigrants to Pass Through Florida.

(From the Times-Union.)

A few days ago we referred editorially to the fact that the North German Lloyd Steamship Company would soon put in service a line of steamships from Bremen to New Orleans to handle the emigrant business. While not expecting this to change the main flow of the immigration tide we think it will prove of benefit to the South and that it will be a paying investment.

The immigrants landing at New Orleans would probably settle in Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas and Texas, but there is a large section of the South that needs immigrants and that offers them favorable conditions that would be no better served through New Orleans than through New York.

For the sake of this territory and of the opportunities it offers homeseekers these ships ought to stop at some South Atlantic port. Charleston, Savannah or Jacksonville would be equally convenient. From either of these ports the Carolinas, Georgia, Florida and parts of Alabama and Tennessee could be reached quicker and at less cost than from New Orleans.

This would not entail the loss of more than a day in the trip and we think the added profits to the company would more than make up for it. Then it would benefit the immigrants in giving them a wider field to select from in looking for homes.

But if the officials of the company were not willing to lose a day the ships could stop at Key West for the landing of such immigrants as might prefer the southeastern States, without any loss of time, for they would necessarily pass Key West. From Key West immigrant rates might be made northward and the immigrants who wished to settle in the southeast might reach a point as far north as Charleston, Atlanta or Montgomery as quickly as those who remained on the boat would reach New Orleans and with little more cost. In supplying a larger territory the company would do a larger business and make more money.

We commend this matter to our business men as worthy of their attention.

Auto Parade in Brooklyn.

Brooklyn, May 19.—Nearly every automobile owned in Brooklyn will turn out to take part in the great automobile parade which the Long Island Automobile Club has arranged for this afternoon. According to a conservative estimate there will be about 1,000 automobiles of all makes in the procession. The start will be made from the Plaza and the parade will move through some of the principal streets, then through Prospect Park and down the Boulevard to Coney Island. Mayor McClellan and a number of other prominent city officials will review the parade.

"Made in Oregon" is the Slogan.

Portland, Ore., May 19.—A great "Made in Oregon" fair, to be held in the streets of this city, opened here today under the auspices of the Oregon Development League and with the support of the business men and citizens in general of this city. Only articles manufactured in this state and products raised in Oregon, are exhibited and the exhibition includes a large number of working displays and demonstrations of various home industries. The fair will last until next Saturday, May 26 and is attracting thousands of visitors from all parts of the State. An elaborate program has been prepared for the week, including a big street parade, which will be held next Friday and will be the climax of the fair week.

Deserves Attention.

On the first page of this issue there is a clipping from the Times-Union, showing that the people of that city are making an effort to have the immigrant ships of the North German Lloyd steamers stop at Key West, in order that some of the immigrants may be induced to locate in this state. Monroe County has thousands of acres of rich farming land uncultivated and thousands of these immigrants might be induced to populate our keys. We would urge the Chamber of Commerce to give this matter their attention and endeavor if possible to have these ships stop here.

The Railway to Key West.

The Flagler road is giving employment to over 4,000 workmen on the Key West extension. This extension is and will forever be the most wonderful railroad building in the history of Florida. What a wonderful transformation Henry M. Flagler has made of the East Coast of the State, from Jacksonville to Key West, at an expenditure probably of \$30,000,000. He has been the State's greatest developer and benefactor.

Many thousands of our own people have followed the opening up of this beautiful and fertile country for settlement, and many are getting in the investment of these millions in our State. Such investments are what makes a state great and prosperous. Just see what will be shipped from the fruit and trucking sections down the East coast this season.

The vegetable output is estimated at nearly a half million crates, and the pineapple crop will foot up nearly as much. There are growers, some from Volusia county, who will make a fortune this season. And still you hear fanatics and anti-corporationists fighting Flagler and his enterprises. Proper guards should be thrown around the operations of railroads as are given the people in the Railroad Commission but this continual foaming at the mouth by fanatics about railroad corporations does the State and her people great harm.—Florida County Record.

At St. Pauls Church.

Jefferson Statue for Washington.

Washington, D. C., May 16.—Arrangements have at last been made to obtain sculptors' designs for the statue of Thomas Jefferson which, by authority of Congress is to be erected in one of the public parks here. The commission charged with the work consists of Secretary Root and the chairmen of the House and Senate Committees on library, and a report has been made to the House by Secretary Root that Augustus St. Gaudens has been obtained as sculptor, and that as soon as Mr. Gaudens' health permits a model will be prepared and submitted to Congress. The delay has been due to the death of Secretary Hay, the former chairman of the commission. Haste will now be made to have the statue finished.
