# Story on Miss Ripon evokes memories and artifacts

The Ripon Historical Society's recent Now&Then in Ripon article about the "Miss Ripon" wooden speedboat, featured in the June 29, 2023 edition of the *Commonwealth*, brought forth memories and artifacts.

"Following publication in both the newspaper and on our historical society Facebook page we were immediately contacted by Gary Lukoski, a long-time resident of Florida and Georgia who grew up in Ripon during the 1960s," said Steve Arbaugh, the article's author.

Lukoski advised the historical society that he was bequeathed a file about the Miss Ripon by wooden boat aficionado and close friend Ron Hoth (1940-2012) prior to Hoth's passing.

"The file includes rare photos of the speedboat during its trial run on Green Lake and award-winning regatta race at Lake Winnebago," Arbaugh said, noting the photos date back to 1924.

Lukoski and his wife spend annual vacations with friends on Green Lake. While staying this past July in Green Lake, he brought his Miss Ripon speedboat file to the Ripon Historical Society for viewing.

While there, Lukoski shared stories about his own interests and experiences searching for classic wooden boats that were "barn finds" — essentially long-unused boats in need of restoration and refurbishing that have been stored in barn and garage buildings.

Lukoski also shared pictures of classic wooden boats that had been restored to bring them "back to the water" for recreational use. Everything in Lukoski's file, including the information he was given by Hoth, has been scanned and will be digitally conserved at the Ripon Historical Society.

#### Part of the mystery continues

After sharing stories and photos, plus reviewing details surrounding the Miss Ripon speedboat, everyone agreed there is still hope of someday finding the boat.

Its builder and sometimes carpenter, Alvin Weingarten (1884-1936), moved to the Omro area after leaving Ripon in the 1900s. No record of the Miss Ripon speedboat being driven or raced exists after her first year of launch. Maybe the Miss Ripon was put into storage somewhere in the Omro area and is waiting to be discovered.

The Ripon Commonwealth once quoted that the Miss

Ripon owners intended to design and build a Miss Ripon II. It was to be a much larger and faster speedboat, but no records or photos of this have surfaced.

## Laconia honored by U.S. News & World Report

Laconia High School was recently named in the *U.S. News & World Report's* Best High Schools in the Nation, finishing among the top 40% of schools in the nation once again.

In addition, Laconia High School was named as the No. 1 high school in Fond du Lac County.

U.S. News & World Report evaluated approximately 18,000 public high schools across the country using school-specific data on enrollment, graduation rates, student body demographics, free and reduced-price lunch, location, school type and state assessment results. The analysis also focuses on participation in and performance on challenging college-level coursework.

A breakdown of each category and percent of the ranking are as follows:

➤ College readiness, based on the proportion of 12th grade students who took and earned a qualifying score on at least one advanced placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) exam (30% of ranking).

- ➤ State assessment proficiency, based on aggregated scores on state assessments that students may be required to pass for graduation (20%).
- ➤ State assessment performance, based on whether performance on state assessments exceeded expectations given the school's proportion of underserved students (20%).
- ➤ Underserved student performance, based on how Black, Hispanic and low-income students performed on state assessments compared with those who are not underserved in the state (10%).
- ➤ College curriculum breadth, based on proportions of 12th-grade students who took and earned a qualifying score on AP and/or IB exams in multiple content areas (10%).
- ➤ Graduation rate, based on the proportion of students who entered ninth grade in 2016-2017 and graduated four years later (10%).

Laconia High School, part of the Rosendale-Brandon School District, serves 329 students and continues its reputation as a school of choice with approximately 21% of its student population attending through open enrollment.
